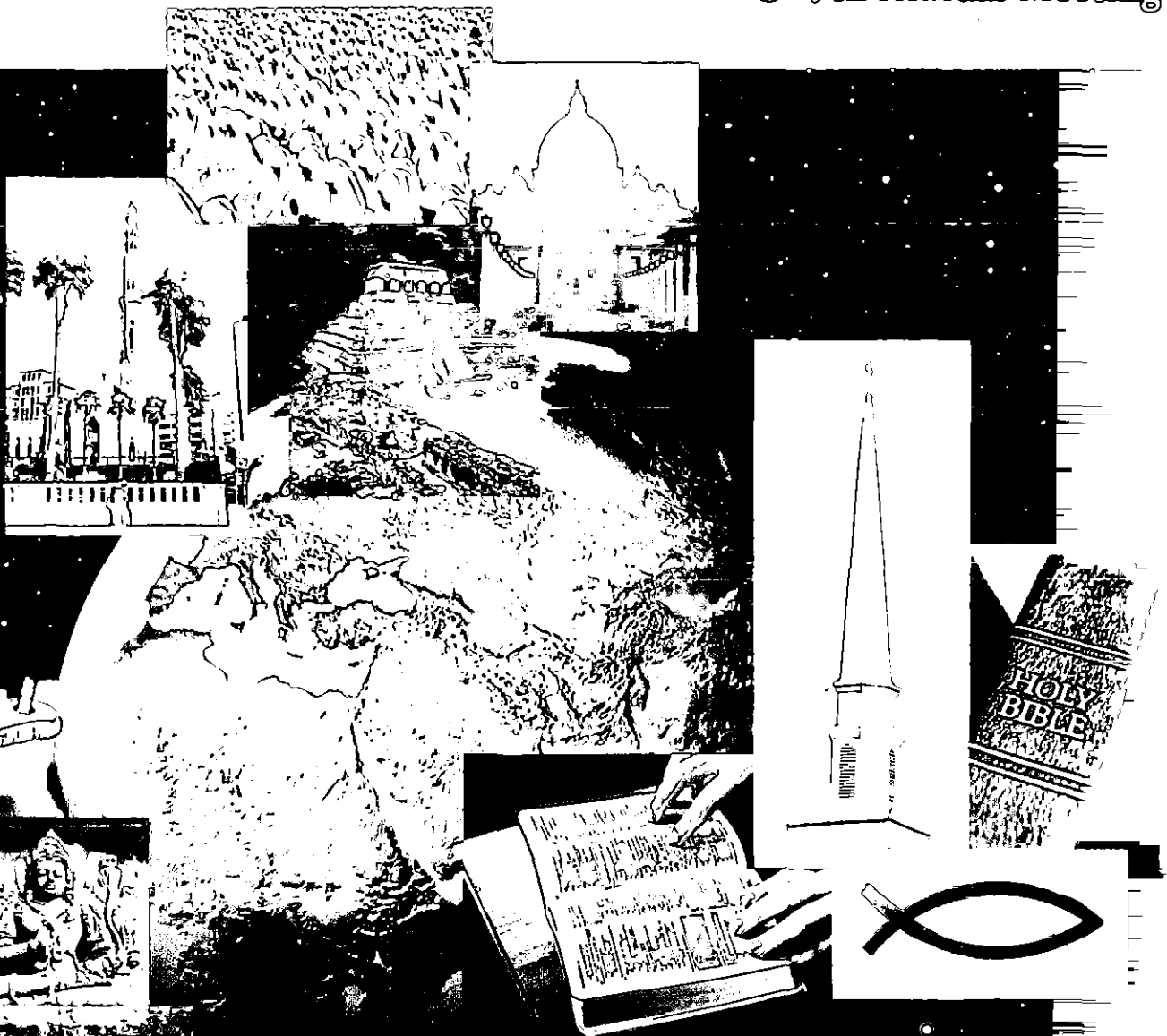

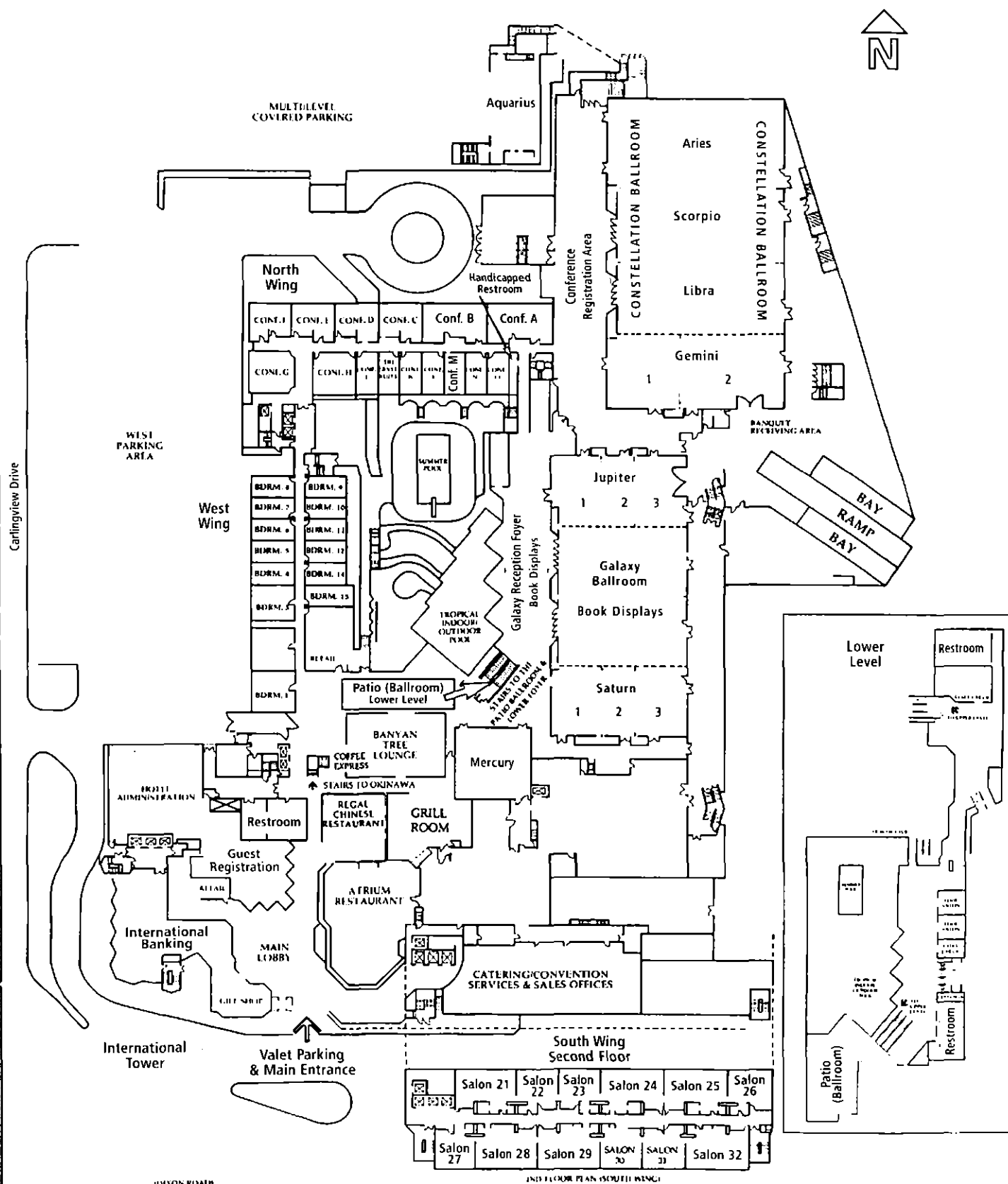

Dear ETS Members and Guests,


Welcome to the 54th Annual Meeting of the Evangelical Theological Society at the Regal Constellation Hotel in Toronto. This year's topic, "Evangelical Christianity and Other Religions," is especially timely, given the post-September 11 discussions of the nature of Islam, Christianity, and many other religions. We have six plenary sessions devoted to the topic, three from biblical or historical perspectives and three relating to the contemporary world, and more than 60 papers on the topic. Our presidential address by Millard J. Erickson will challenge us to think about our task of doing theological scholarship in the new century.

Our Society continues its healthy growth, both in numbers and in quality of papers. One sign of this is that we have experienced a very encouraging growth of study groups in recent years, each focused on a specific subdiscipline and contributing to in-depth exploration of themes and areas of study in ways not possible previously; 20 are meeting this year. In all, more than 300 ETS papers are scheduled, both in study groups and open sessions. Combined with the offerings of our affiliated societies—the Evangelical Philosophical Society, Near East Archaeological Society, and Adventist Theological Society—the overall total is more than 350. Also this year, the open papers are grouped by discipline, so that participants in the same disciplines will find groupings of papers of mutual interest.

Our hotel is ideal for our meetings: large enough to accommodate our needs easily, yet small enough to enable easy getting around to sessions. There are good restaurants in the hotel itself, and in several other hotels and stand-alone establishments nearby, as well, catering to every budget. Toronto is a world-class city and there are plenty of tourism opportunities for any who are interested; be sure to check out the information on this elsewhere in the program. I especially thank Mr. Suleiman Alia ("Alia"), Catering and Convention Service Manager, for his unfailingly gracious help in planning our meeting. I trust you will make it a point to thank him and the entire hotel staff for their services to us.

In the Old Testament, one category of foreigners was the *gerim*, the resident aliens, known in the Septuagint as the *proslutoi*, the proselytes. Although ethnically not descendants of Abraham, they became Israelites by responding to Israel's God in faith, which happened through their contacts with the Israelites and the favorable treatment they received. Given this year's theme ("Evangelical Christianity and Other Religions"), it is especially appropriate to be reminded of the *gerim*. During our time in Toronto—one of the world's most ethnically and religiously diverse cities—we, like Israel long before us, have a wonderful opportunity to testify to our God by our treatment of those with whom we come in contact. May we remember this important task as we pursue our usual conference activities of deepening our knowledge of God and glorifying him in the pursuit of our scholarly disciplines. *Soli Deo Gloria!*

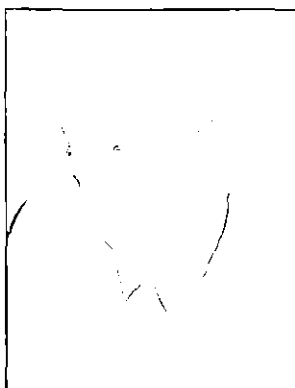
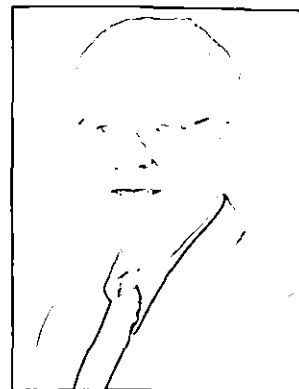

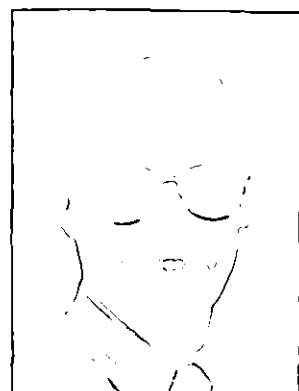

ROOMS

The ETS room rates per night are \$109.00 (Canadian) for economy; \$129.00 (Canadian) for standard; \$139.00 (Canadian) for premium west; \$149.00 (Canadian) for premium South; and \$159.00 for club.
