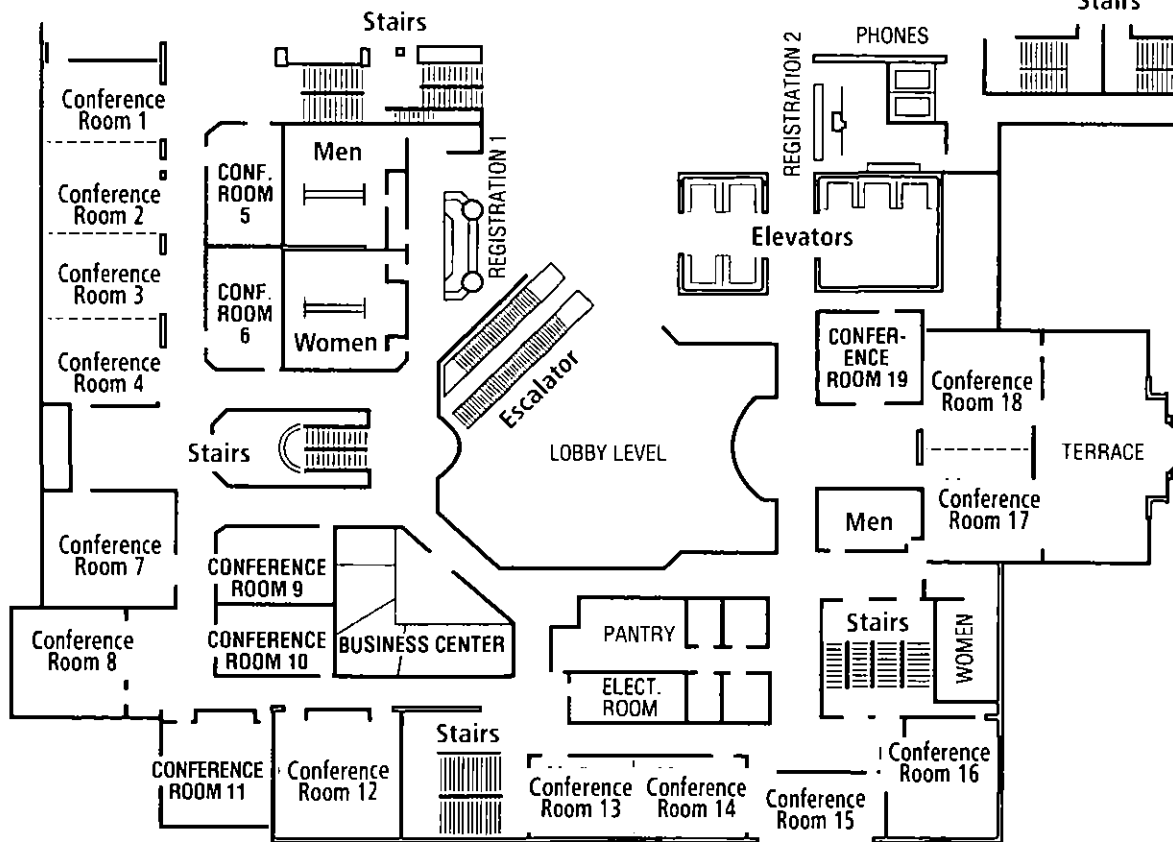
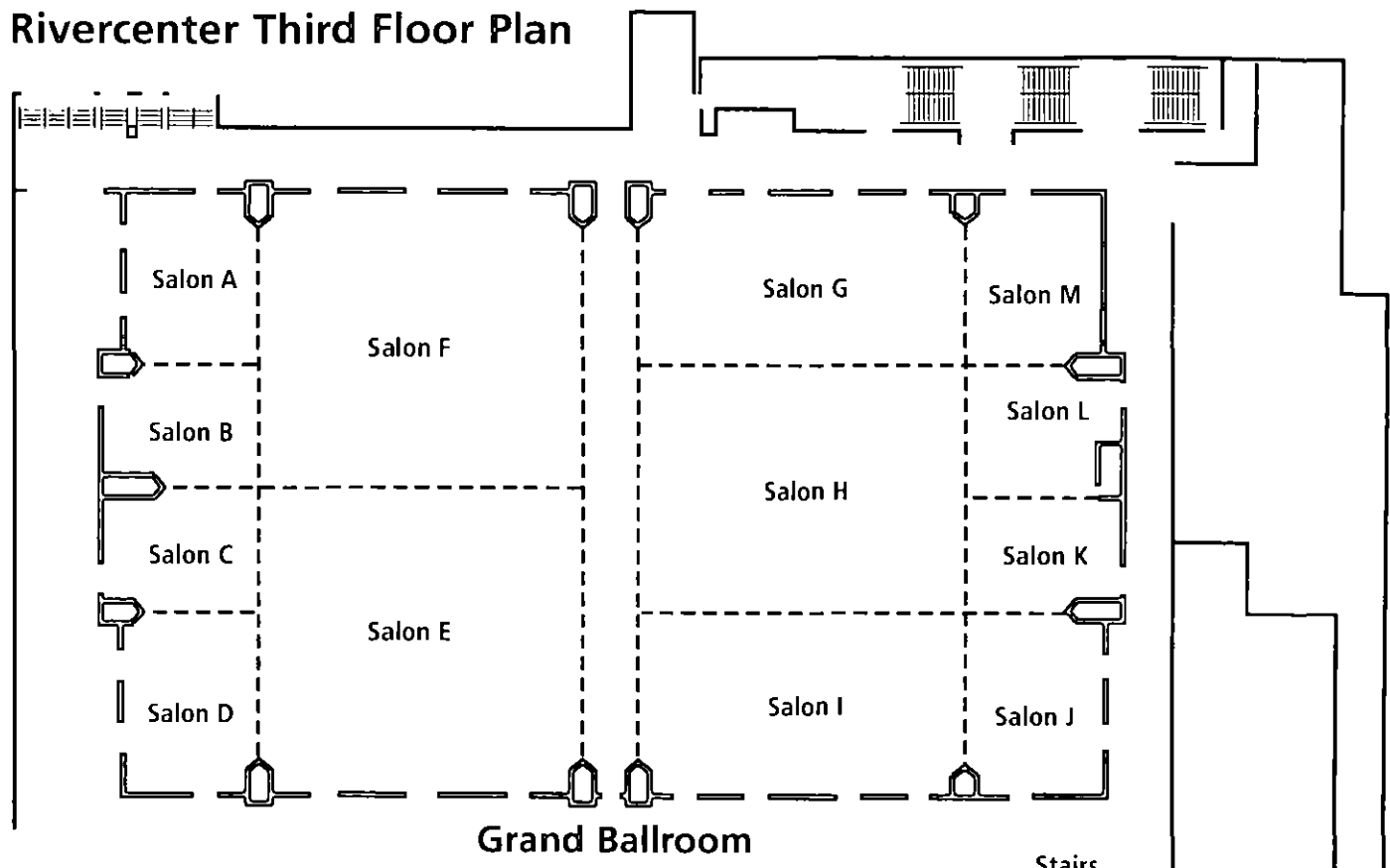

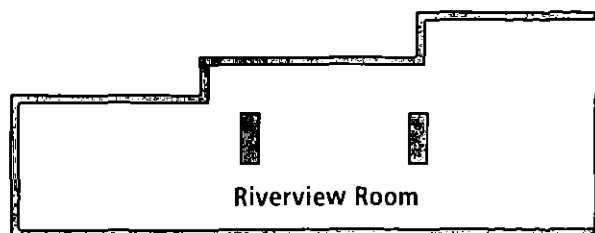
Riverwalk Second Floor Plan
