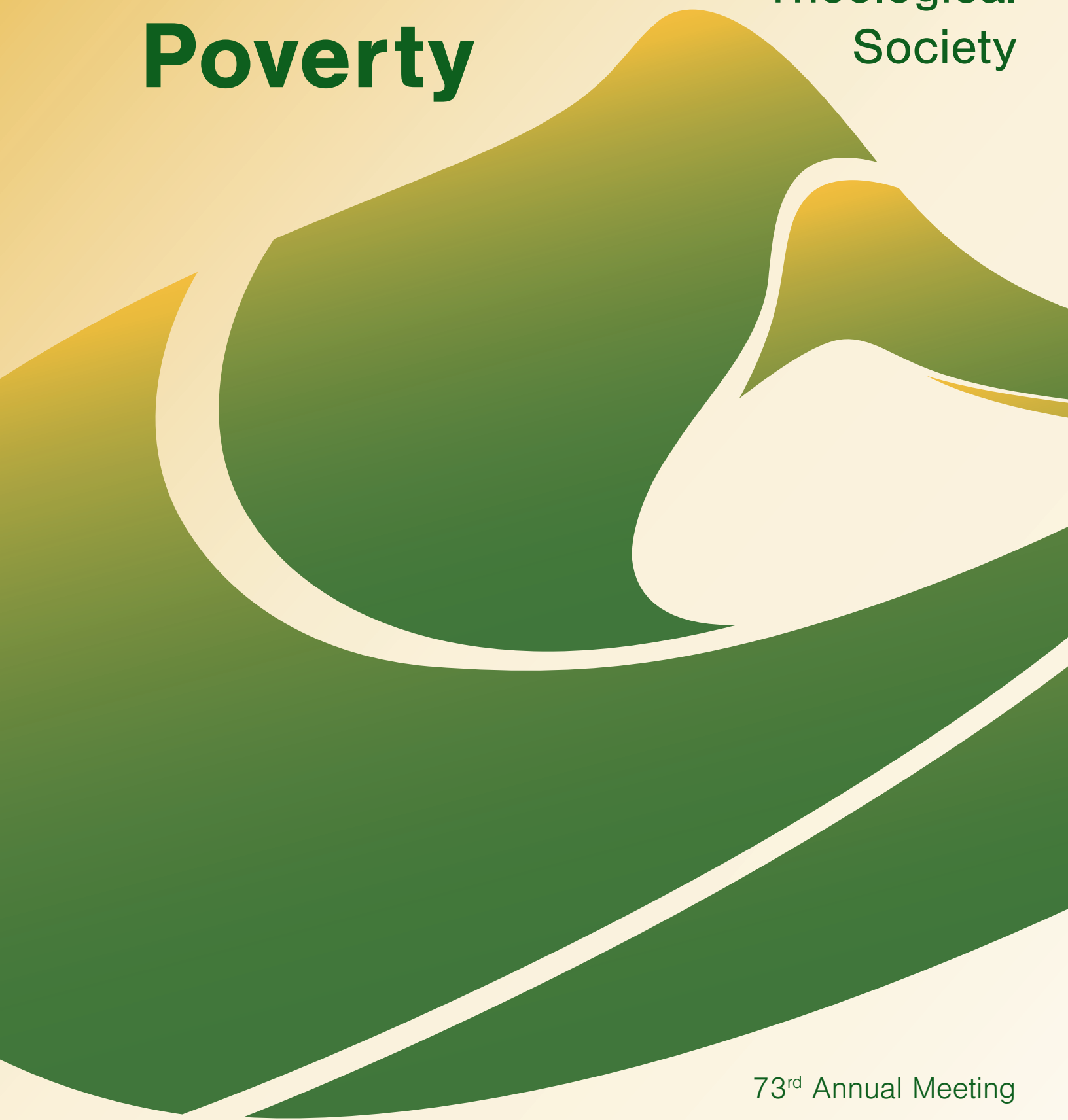

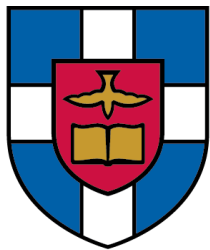

Letter from the Program Chair

Welcome to the 73rd Annual Meeting of the Evangelical Theological Society

The Executive Committee of ETS periodically includes in its agenda a careful, prayerful discussion about the theme that should control the agenda of the ETS Annual Meetings several years in advance. The Committee looks for themes that have not been treated substantially for some time, themes that are intrinsically important and that are of concern to the various sectors of our Society (biblical studies, theology, historical theology, ethics, and so forth), themes that have fostered significant differences of opinion, and, ideally, themes that are percolating in Christian circles and need competent discussion. This year's theme, "Wealth and Poverty," meets all of these criteria, and is so vast and multi-faceted that one of my chief fears is how little of it we shall be able to address.

Three plenary addresses will go a long way to set the tone. In the order of their lectures: (1) Michael Andres, Professor of Biblical and Theological Studies at Northwestern College, Orange City, Iowa, will address us on "Poor Theology: A Christian Theology of Poverty and Wealth" (Tuesday, November 16, 5:25 pm); (2) Anne Bradley, Vice President of Economic Initiatives, Institute for Faith, Work and Economics, Tysons, Virginia, will speak under the title, "Complements not Substitutes: Biblical Human Flourishing and Economic Freedom" (Wednesday, November 17, 1:00 pm); and (3) Brian Fikkert, President of The Chalmers Center and Professor of Economics and Community Development at Covenant College, Lookout Mountain, Georgia, will lecture on "Getting Our Story Straight: Homo Economicus or Homo Imago Dei?" (Thursday, November 18, 8:30 am).

We received more than twice as many submissions as we could accept. Nevertheless, the program includes over three hundred papers, some on our designated theme, and many others on a wide range of topics. Members will also look forward to the presidential address, delivered this year by R. Albert Mohler. After a challenging year in which personal interaction was limited, we will also rejoice in renewing the bonds of friendship and fellowship that tie us together.

Many thanks go to our hard-working program committees, the Executive Committee, and the volunteers who contribute hugely to making our programs fruitful and enjoyable. Special thanks to our Executive Director, Ken Magnuson, and Meeting Planner, Bonnie Thigpen, for the hours of careful attention to detail that characterize their service.

I look forward to seeing you, God willing, in Fort Worth.

The parallel sessions are composed of five different session types.

P Program Unit Sessions

are a combination of invited papers and proposed presentations which were selected by the program unit steering committees. ETS has three types of program units: Consultations, Study Groups, and Sections. Consultations are new program units which are responsible for one session of invited papers at the annual meeting. Study Groups are narrowly focused groups which require active, collaborative participation by the group members. ETS encourages Study Groups to publish the results of their work. Study groups are responsible for one session of invited papers at the annual meeting. Sections are broadly defined groups that represent general areas of interest. Responsible for one session of invited papers and one session of papers drawn from member submissions, the Sections offer the most access for unsolicited papers.

A Affiliated Society Sessions

feature presentations that were selected and arranged by one of the three societies which join ETS each year: the Evangelical Philosophical Society, the Near East Archaeological Society, and the Adventist Theological Society.

D Discipline Specific Sessions

are composed of presentations that were submitted by ETS members and rated by a panel of scholars who served under the direction of the program chair. These presentations have been grouped into basic disciplines: Old Testament, New Testament, Systematic Theology, Church History/Historical Theology, and Practical Theology.

T Theme Sessions

are composed of presentations submitted by members, which address the conference theme. These presentations were evaluated by a panel of scholars under the direction of the program chair. The theme presentations have been arranged into cohesive sessions based on texts, topics, and methods.

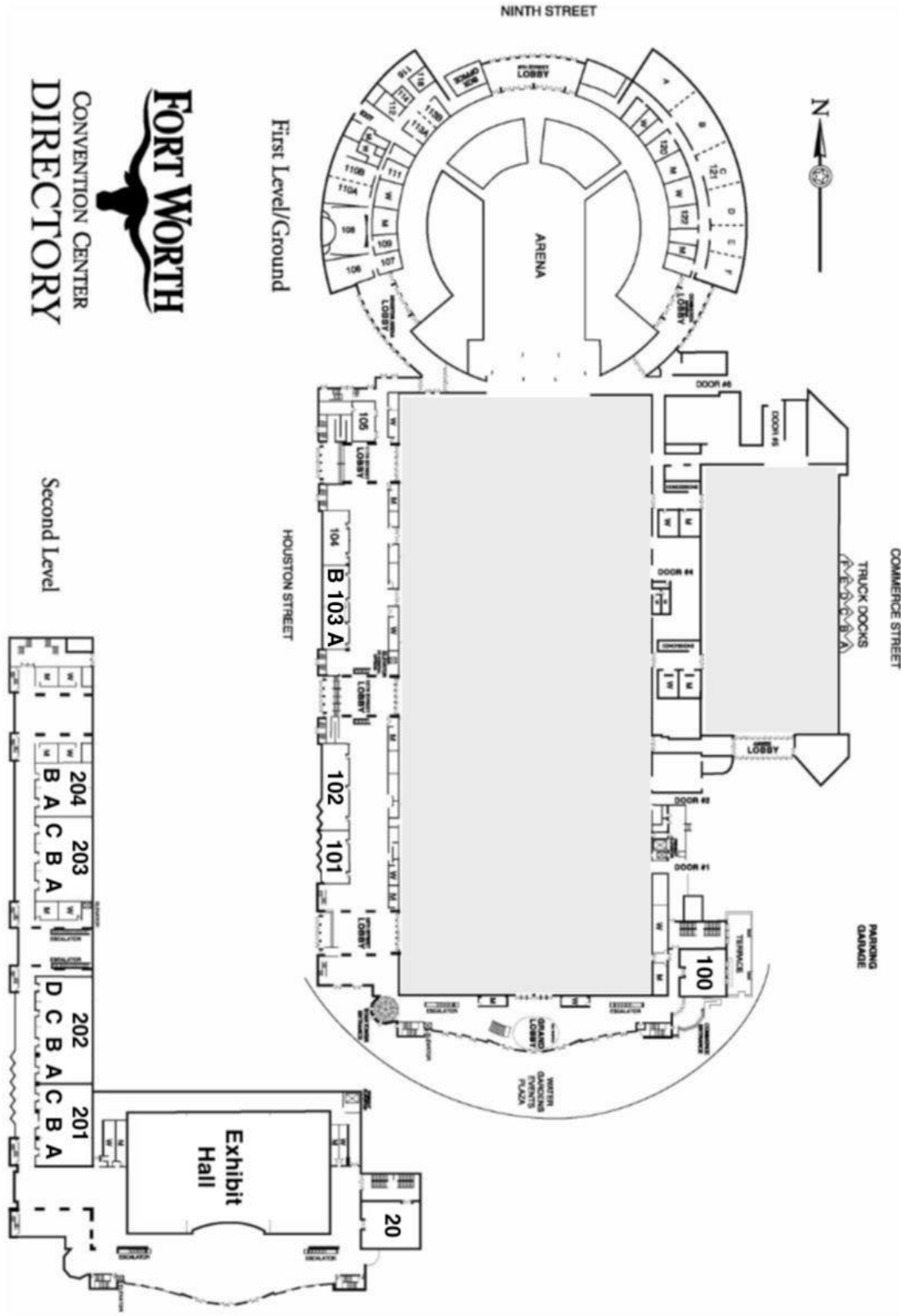

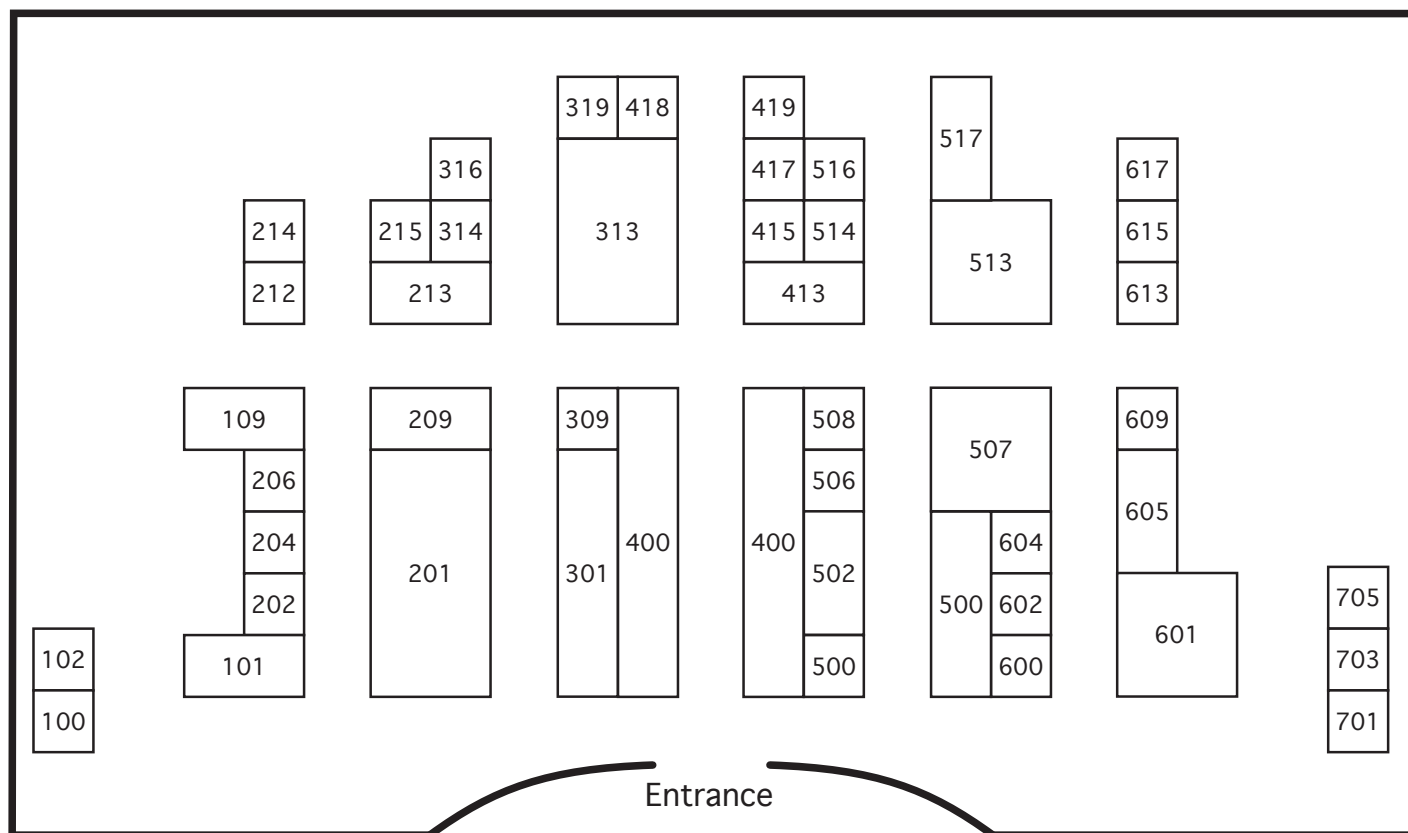
