Student paper competition. Undergraduate or graduate students within the Eastern region may submit a paper (Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia). Students do not need to be ETS members to participate, but papers proposed should be consistent with the theme of the conference and the doctrinal basis of ETS. Student papers may or may not be slated for presentation. Complete papers must be submitted electronically as a PDF by February 24th and should not exceed five thousand words. Please email your student paper submissions and any questions to Jordan W. Jones (jjones@regent.edu). Recognition and prizes will be given to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place papers.
