Nicene Creed (381)

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God; begotten of the Father before all worlds: God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made. Who, for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven. and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was made man: and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate: he suffered and was buried: and the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father: and he shall come again, with glory, to judge the living and the dead:

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life;
who proceeds from the Father [and the Son];
who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped
and glorified;
who spoke by the prophets.
I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church.
I acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins;
and I look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Letter from the Program Chair



Welcome to the 77th annual meeting of the Evangelical Theological Society.

In December 1949, 60 scholars gathered at the YMCA in Cincinnati, OH, at the first meeting of the ETS "to foster conservative biblical scholarship by providing a medium for the oral exchange and written expression of thought and research in the general field of the theological disciplines as centered in the Scripture." Much has changed over the past 77 years, but God has been faithful in blessing the work of the ETS, with a current membership of over 4200 and roughly half of the membership attending the annual meetings in a given year.

The Board of Directors chooses the themes of the annual meetings several years in advance. The theme for this year is Creedal Christianity, celebrating the 1700th Anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. We will hear three plenary sessions on this year's theme. In addition to several sessions devoted to the theme of Creedal Christianity, members will present papers on topics from across the theological disciplines.

Our three plenary speakers for the 77th Annual Meeting are Dr. Craig Blaising, Dr. Lewis Ayres, and Dr. Fred Sanders. Dr. Blaising, Senior Professor of Theology at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminar, will address "The Bible and the Nicene Creed." Dr. Ayres, Professor of Catholic and Historical Theology at Durham University, will speak on "Why is Nicaea so Important?" Dr. Sanders, Professor at Torrey Honors College at Biola University, will feature, "The Substance of Pro-Nicene Evangelical Systematics: For Us and For Our Salvation."

Additionally, our President this year Dr. Craig Blomberg, Distinguished Professor of New Testament at Denver Seminary, will give his presidential address at our banquet on "The Parable of the Vineyard Workers: How Best to Resent God's Grace." We look forward to hearing from each of our speakers.

As a result of the continuing growth of the ETS, we receive many more proposals for papers than there is time for presentations. While only about half the proposals submitted can be accepted, we are grateful for all members who have offered to contribute their work to the program.

Special thanks go to our Executive Director, Dr. Ken Magnuson, and to our Meeting Planner, Bonnie Thigpen, and their many hours of work in preparation for these meetings. We also deeply appreciate the program committees, the executive committees and our volunteers, without whom these meetings could not occur.

Explanation of Parallel Session Types

P Program Unit Sessions

are a combination of invited papers and proposed presentations which were selected by the program unit steering committees. ETS has three types of program units: Consultations, Study Groups, and Sections. Consultations are new program units which are responsible for one session of invited papers at the annual meeting. Study Groups are narrowly focused groups which require active, collaborative participation by the group members. ETS encourages Study Groups to publish the results of their work. Study groups are responsible for one session of invited papers at the annual meeting. Sections are broadly defined groups that represent general areas of interest. Responsible for one session of invited papers and one session of papers drawn from member submissions, the Sections offer the most access for unsolicited papers.

A Affiliated Society Sessions

feature presentations that were selected and arranged by one of the three societies which join ETS each year: the Evangelical Philosophical Society, the Near East Archaeological Society, and the Adventist Theological Society.

T Theme Sessions

are composed of presentations submitted by members, which address the conference theme. These presentations were evaluated by a panel of scholars under the direction of the program chair. The theme presentations have been arranged into cohesive sessions based on texts, topics, and methods.

G General Discipline Sessions

are composed of presentations that were submitted by ETS members and rated by a panel of scholars who served under the direction of the program chair. These presentations have been grouped into basic disciplines: Old Testament, New Testament, Systematic Theology, Church History/Historical Theology, and Practical Theology.
